- Act as first assist in Cesarean Sections
- Demonstrate ability to work independently while recognizing situations which require the immediate attention of a physician with appropriate consultation and or transfer to MD care
- Effectively communicate and interact professionally, positively, and constructively with staff, physicians, patients, and the general public of varying and diverse backgrounds
